
Trimley St Mary Parish Council



Welcome to the Trimley St Mary Parish Council news June 2025

Upgrade to play area at Faulkener's Way: East Suffolk Council and Trimley St Mary Parish Council have been working closely together on 4 designs and Wicksteed from Northampton were the chosen design and received the majority support from the public consultation. The PC was involved in the long design period, to ensure it met with the criteria of the prime age group that uses this area.

The Parish Council have invested 40 % of the total £85,000 cost Councillor Stuart Bird granted £4916 from his locality Budget. This equipment will replace the existing 45-year-old play equipment. The Gym area will stay.

There are some exciting play pieces, including the much-requested Zip Wire which will be sited outside the enclosed area.

The PC is indebted to ESC officers Tim Snook and Sarah Shinnie for the pursuance of the project since its proposal in March 2023.

The site is owned and maintained by East Suffolk Council (only one owned by them in the village). We also have plans to make some upgrades to Stennetts play equipment which is owned by the Parish Council

An anticipated opening is planned in June, ready for the Summer Holidays. There have been some slight changes to the design, and this can be found on our website and Facebook page.
